## Is Your Forest Healthy?

This workshop is designed to give landowners experience identifying and measuring factors that affect a forest's health. Workshop participants will learn how to recognize forest problems and how to manage their own woodlots so they are resilient and resist insects, diseases, and other damaging agents.

Landowners will learn how to measure forest health indicators and assess risk. A two-hour field trip to observe management treatments will follow the three-hour indoor workshop. During the field trip, you will learn about thinning, pruning, debris disposal, forest health assessment, and fire hazard risk reduction techniques. You will go home with a forestry instrument for assessing stand conditions in your forest.

**Please note:** Half of the workshop will be outdoors so please be prepared for the weather. Workshop will be held rain or shine.
