Market Large Animal Weighing and Tagging Dates for Grant County Fair

BEEF—Members are able to tag their own animals at home (similar to the swine, goats and lambs). The traditional weighing and tagging event (participation optional) will be open from 1:00 -3:00 pm on Saturday April 20. All members are responsible for turning in their tag photos to Ana (ana.myers@wsu.edu) by end of day, Saturday April 20th. **Remember, if you are in 4-H your enrollment needs to also be fully completed by this ownership date.* Beef tags will be available at the office for pick up after March 10.

SWINE—Photos of tags in ears to Ana by Saturday May 18

GOAT/SHEEP—photos showing tags in the ears due to Ana by June 14

The Project Review is a four-page document using information found in the record books. These will be required for all live animal projects (one review per species) attending the fair regardless of sale status. The 4-H project Review forms are available at the Extension Office.

Attention Grant County Fair Poultry Market Project Members

A paper certificate will need to be turned in June 24. Breed/variety and hatch dates vary by species and are as follows:

Chicken (Freedom Ranger Broiler-not APA standard bred) hatched May 27-June 10, 2024

Duck (Pekin: commercial/jumbo/hybrid) hatched May 27-June 17, 2024

Turkey (any broad breasted variety) hatched April 18-May 6, 2024

Goose (any APA 'medium' breed) hatched January 1-February 12, 2024

We do have information regarding further details of the poultry market project which will be emailed out to each project family individually. (this information is specific to the Grant County Fair Poultry project)
