



GRANT COUNTY 4-H UPDATE

February 2024

The name 'February' is based on a Latin term for cleansing, or purification. In ancient times the Romans set aside the month of Februalia as a time to reset and purify themselves. Interestingly it was made shorter by a couple emperors moving a day from February and adding it to months named after themselves (July for Julias Cesar and August for Augustus Cesar). February has been the second month on the calendar since about 450 BC. February 2nd is Groundhog Day, based on a Germanic tradition but in Germany it is a ground-dwelling badger that predicts the upcoming weather. The 10th of February marks the celebration of Lunar New year which is celebrated widely throughout East Asia. This holiday begins with the first new Moon after the Winter Solstice and is associated with the Chinese Zodiac. There are many crafts and suggested ways to celebrate this cultural celebration online. The month also marks Black History Month which has been celebrated in this country since 1926. February is one of the most misspelled words in the English language (it is the 'r' after the 'b' that throws people off). Violets which symbolize diligence, fidelity and loyalty are the flowers associated with the month of February. This year is unique in that February has 29 days, a day added to the calendar every four years. The chance of being born on February 29 is one in 1461. Those born on leap day are called 'leaplings' and there are about 4 million folks who share that birthday.

The month of February marks some important dates in our 4-H program as well. The late fee is applied to member fees on the first of February. Our first animal ownership date is also on the 1st. There are many things lined up this spring making for a busy few months. A page sharing many of the important dates, including animal tagging and ownership details will be mailed to you soon. A special note for those who are planning on showing market poultry, please note the section near the end of this letter about hatch dates and the ownership certificate.

A paper certificate will need to be turned in by June 24. Breed/variety and hatch dates vary by species and are as follows:

- Chicken (Freedom Ranger Broiler—not APA standard bred) hatched May 27-June 10, 2024
- Duck (Pekin: commercial/jumbo/hybrid) hatched May 27-June 17, 2024
- Turkey (any broad breasted variety) hatched April 18—May 6, 2024
- Goose (any APA 'medium' breed) hatched January 1-February 12, 2024


