



GRANT COUNTY 4-H UPDATE

July 2024

Happy July.

Summer is here and I hope you have all had a lovely few weeks adjusting to schedules with less classroom time. Fair will be here in SIX weeks. Hard to believe but we all know it tends to sneak up on us. Now is the time to work on your posters, records, and fair decorations. As fun as the fair is, we always should remember it is a place where we showcase our 4-H projects and what we have learned. There are four essential elements of the program—belonging, independence, generosity, and mastery. What are ways you can exhibit these four concepts when displaying your project(s) at the fair?

Last Saturday was our State Livestock judging contest here in Moses Lake. A big thank you goes out to the Grant County Fairgrounds for providing us space to conduct this contest that develops life skills. There were over 120 youth from around the state who participated and judged classes of beef, goats, lambs, and swine. Thank you to all who worked to make this program a success!

Summer is a great time to make connections. There are still several host families needed for our Japanese delegates who arrive in less than three weeks. Hosting for 25 days is an opportunity to encounter someone else's culture but also really learn about yourself! The list of delegates is at the end of this newsletter.

Please remember that registration for the Grant County Fair (through FairEntry) closes on July 10. It is a computer program, which means glitches are possible. Please do not wait until the last minute to sign up. All 4-H projects (livestock, dogs, and still-life) will need to be entered by July 10. All posters, photography, and record books/project reviews will come to the Extension Office by Friday July 26. Other still-life entries will be checked in at the 4-H building Sunday, August 11 from 3:00 to 6:00 pm.

With public safety and education being a top priority of our county fairs, this year we will see some changes to the herdsmanship schedule. The purpose of this contest is to provide education to fairgoers, keep them safe, maintain the comfort of the animals, and showcase the learning surrounding the project area. Our largest crowds of fairgoers come through the gate after 5:00 pm. To be more available to answer questions, care for the animals, and maintain the cleanliness of the barns during heavier attendance hours, the herdsmanship schedules have been altered. As in the past, the pens and barns will be expected to be cleaned by 8:00 am before the showing begins. However, the new change is the judging of herdsmanship will run between noon and 8:00 pm. Please discuss the needs of the exhibits and consider the realities of club families as you create your schedules. One suggestion has been to schedule older members who are staying at the fairgrounds for the shifts later in the day.

Anyone wishing to deliver a public presentation at the fair will need to participate in a county demonstration day. Our last one is scheduled for July 16 here at the Extension Office. Please RSVP to be put on the schedule. Leaders Council has agreed to pay enrollment fees for the coming program year for all youth who give a presentation at the fair. Being able to speak publicly is a great life skill that many of our 4-H alumni are grateful for and often credit to their past club experiences.
