Hello,

May first has been celebrated since ancient times as a time to celebrate growth. Fields are sprouting, young animals abound and the lengthening days joined with warmer weather are all appreciated. Throughout the world various cultures celebrate May Day with flowers, dancing, special decorations and specific local traditions.

May is also Mental Health Awareness Month. The national council for wellbeing suggests several self-care activities that can greatly enhance mental wellbeing. 4-H Leaders, Help Name WSU's New Apple in an Online Contest!

For more than 20 years, Washington State University's newest apple has been known by a mix of numbers and initials. It's now time for apple lovers to give "WA 64" a name. An online survey and contest is currently open, seeking a distinctive name for this pink-hued, firmly crisp, sweet, and tart apple. A hybrid of Honeycrisp and Cripps Pink, a variety better known as the trademarked Pink Lady® apple, "WA 64" has outstanding eating and storage qualities. It was selected for the fresh market.

The contest to name the apple is open to all U.S. residents age 18 and older, and ends May 5. Along with name ideas, survey respondents are also asked a few additional questions, including why they chose their suggestion and whether they have purchased fresh apples in the past three months.

ATTENTION Grant County Fair Poultry Market Project Members

A paper certificate will need to be turned in by Monday, June 24. Breed/variety and hatch dates vary by species and are as follows:

- Chicken (Freedom Ranger Broiler—not APA standard bred) hatched May 27-June 10, 2024
- Duck (Pekin: commercial/jumbo/hybrid) hatched May 27-June 17, 2024
- Turkey (any broad breasted variety) hatched April 18—May 6, 2024
- Goose (any APA 'medium' breed) hatched January 1-February 12, 2024

We do have information regarding further details of the Poultry Market Project which will be emailed out to each project family individually. This information is specific to the Grant County Fair Poultry Project.
