

HORTICULTURE & MASTER GARDENER CLASSES

These classes are for individuals that want to increase their knowledge of gardening and horticulture. Class participants can also become UI & WSU Extension Master Gardener Volunteers. Master Gardener volunteers are selected on an application basis by the local WSU and UI Extension Offices. There is no limit on individuals that want to take the class for their own personal benefit and DO NOT intend to become Master Gardener Volunteers.

WHAT IS A MASTER GARDENER VOLUNTEER?

The UI and WSU Extension Master Gardner programs train volunteers to become community educators that provide science-based information on horticulture and



environmentally sound gardening practices.

You find Master Gardeners at Plant Clinics giving free garden and landscape advice to the public. You may also find them teaching Sustainable Gardening classes, writing horticultural articles, delivering youth gardening programs, and helping at Community Gardens. They also help out at county fairs, provide educational workshops for the public and teach composting workshops at local schools.

Please contact your local Extension office regarding program requirements for becoming a WSU or U of I Master Gardener Volunteer.

HOW DO I BECOME A MASTER GARDENER?

- The Master Gardener Volunteer program is on an application basis. Please return the class application to the WSU Asotin County Extension office by December 22, 2017.
- Individuals interested in becoming Master Gardeners are encouraged to attend an informational meeting to learn more about the county-based Master Gardener programs.
- Individuals accepted as MG Trainees also need to complete the WSU On-line Training Modules and pass each chapter quiz. (You will need your own computer and email address).



HOW MUCH DOES THE TRAINING COST?

The cost is \$130 for the full 15-week course (payable to WSU Asotin County Master Gardeners). That works out to be less than \$9 for each 3.5 hour class. Payments are due into the Asotin County Extension Office by January 4th. Individuals accepted as Master Gardener Volunteers will need to pay an <u>additional</u> \$75 fee (payable with a credit card directly to WSU) for the "On-line Master Gardener Training Module" which includes a DVD of the course when completed. The \$75 fee will be refunded upon completion of the Master Gardener training and completing all internship requirements.
