Wednesday August 10th Decorate the 4-H Building (likely start about 1PM)

Monday August 15, Help with Livestock Check In, Green Gate 1-3PM. Note this is a slower time
for check ins. There will be shade and water available for volunteers.

Tuesday – Saturday of Fair (August 16-20), need adults and youth to sit in the 4-H building to be
available to answer questions about 4-H.

Sunday Aug, 21st will be clean up at the fair. Looking for adults to help with still life projects
being collected from 8:00-1:00 and then help taking down decorations from 8:00-1:00

Discussion.

In years previous, Leaders Council has purchased pizza (up to \$125) for the still life judges on
Monday night in the 4-H Building. This year the council opted to forgo this expense.

The judges arrive around 8PM and usually have already eaten.
