To increase understanding and to ensure that all our members and families begin the program year with the same interpretation, please read the following statements and sign the below.

I understand that the 4-H Youth Development program is administered by Washington State University and emphasizes the essential elements of belonging, independence, generosity and mastery.

I understand that some 4-H projects require ownership documentation, potential added veterinary expenses, possible blood testing, educational training certification, ear tag deadlines and perhaps participating in certain event requirements in order to be eligible to attend other events (such as fairs).

I understand that my leaders are volunteering their time and sharing their knowledge. They are guides but I am responsible for the care and maintenance of my 4-H project(s).

I understand that the opportunity to participate in local fairs or events to showcase my project is a privilege and not a mandatory part of the program. Only members in good standing are able to participate in fairs.

To be considered a member in good standing I will need to:

- Fully enroll in the program through 4honline
- Abide by the Washington State 4-H Policy
- Attend a minimum of six club general business meetings
- Complete an educational demonstration and present it to my club members
- Participate in a community service project
- Keep records of my project(s).
- Be aware of and be responsible for specific project deadlines and requirements.
