I hereby agree to abide by the following:

- 1) The requirements of WAC 16-228-1460 including, but not limited to;
  - a) Follow all applicable use directions and restrictions on the federal, state or experimental use pesticide label.
  - b) No application will be made to an aquatic or residential site under this collective experimental use permit. I understand that I must obtain an individual experimental use permit for tests involving aquatic or residential application.
  - c) Use will not exceed one acre per active ingredient per year under this experimental use permit. I understand that I must obtain an individual experimental use permit for tests involving more than one acre of land. Further, I understand that a federal experimental use permit approved by EPA must be obtained for large-scale testing.
  - d) All treated human food or animal feed crops will be destroyed unless a tolerance greater than residues anticipated from the treatment or exemption from the requirement of a tolerance has been obtained from the Environmental Protection Agency. "Destroyed" means rendered unusable for food or feed or used for research purposes only.
  - e) Any adverse environmental effects will be immediately reported to the department;
  - f) Summaries of experimental results, date and method of disposal of treated food or feed crop (if applicable), and any adverse environmental effects resulting from the application shall be retained by the holder of the permit for three years and shall be submitted to the department upon request of the director.
  - g) Pesticides intended for experimental use must be contained in secure containers, the labeling of which must present such precautions as are known to be necessary to protect human health and prevent unreasonable adverse environmental effects. Any unused experimental use pesticide that does not have a registered use in the state must be returned to the manufacturer or disposed of properly within three years of the conclusion of the experiment.
- 2) Experimental testing of federally restricted use fumigants and/or fumigants that meet the criteria of Toxicity Category I (e.g. DANGER signal word) or post-harvest storage is not allowed under a Collective EUP (AGR 630-4130). For these tests use the Terrestrial EUP form (AGR 630-4257).

The director may limit the amount of pesticide, acres or areas to be treated, licensing, or qualifications of persons exercising the permit, or any other condition of an experimental use permit. The director may deny, amend, suspend or revoke any experimental use permit if it is found to be in violation of applicable federal regulations, in violation of chapters 15.58 and 17.21 RCW or rules adopted thereunder, or if the director deems such action necessary to protect public health and the environment.
